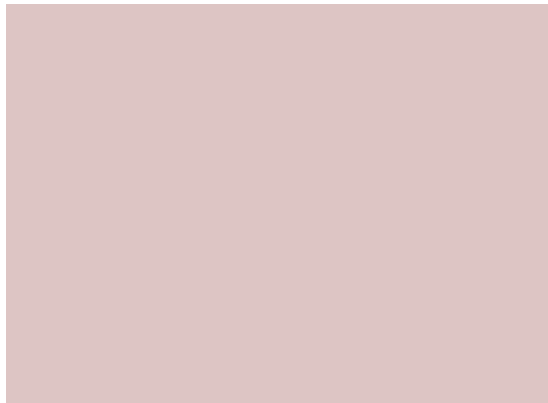
What does it mean to ‘love your neighbour’?

In a parable about God’s judgment (also called the parable of the sheep and the goats) Jesus says: *“The righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in? . . . When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?’ The King will reply, ‘I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.’”* (Matthew 25 v 37)



Why should mission be important to me?

As individuals and as God’s church, we are called to reach out to others. Jesus commanded us to *“love your neighbour as yourself”* (Matthew 22 v 39). He is our teacher and our model for this command. The Bible says God wants us to share our time, talents and treasure to serve all nations. We in the Cathedral family have been blessed with many gifts. Through our personal commitment and our collective action, we will be strengthened as individual Christians and as a mission-focused church.

We also want to lead the congregation into action to make a difference around the globe – this could include organizing short-term mission trips in the future.

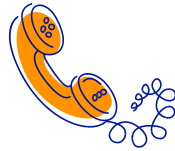


At Christ Church Cathedral we are already active in mission work. Here are some of our projects:
